1. The excellent mission flown by your 370th and 371st bombardment squadrons against Vunakanau on the morning of 16 March came to my attention too late for me to send you a well done by radio.

2. I was particularly impressed with the demonstration of overall control over the bombing which this leader obviously had. With it it was possible for one squadron to lay an excellent pattern into the eight-tenths obscured primary target while the other squadron, unable to get a positive aiming point, successfully held its bombs for later perfect delivery on Tobera Airfield.

3. It was very gratifying to me, indeed, to have such a successful and well controlled mission accomplished on the first morning of my tour of duty as ComAirSols.


